The wine...

Cabernet Sauvignon is one of the most important components used in creating the Meritage blend upon which Lyeth has built its success. The wine allows Lyeth to showcase this varietal in a way that reveals the individual qualities it contributes. Rich and luscious flavors with balanced acidity and smooth tannins ensure this is a wine that pairs well with food and entices the palate to take another sip.

The 2016 Sonoma County Cabernet Sauvignon is crafted from vineyards in the Dry Creek Valley, blending in a small amount of Merlot and Malbec to produce a harmonious wine with balanced complexity and a lingering finish. The nose on this bold wine opens with aromas of dusty plum, lavender and a touch of cherry. The palate offers a savory, full bodied mouthful featuring flavors of dried fruits, white pepper, tobacco leaf and a hint of orange zest.
